Grade 12 Grad Events & Eligibility Letter

September 8, 2023

Dear Grade 12's and Parent/Guardians,

With the first week of school completed, I hope our Grade 12 students have settled into a routine and are finding success, engagement and enjoyment in their academics as well as their extra-curricular pursuits. In our grade assembly, we talked about the importance of staying organized, being on top of their school work, and finding ways to make positive contributions to their school and community – the legacy they hope to leave as a graduating class and the role they play as leaders in the school. They play an integral in helping to establish a positive school culture and the modelling of being a "good PACER" for our younger students – *Participate, Achieve, Care, Explore, and Respect.*

We also spoke about "Grad Events" and how these events are created to recognize, honour and celebrate our graduating class. In addition to the events organized by the school, a Grad Council will be created to organize and implement a variety of events to build community, celebrate the graduating class and fundraise for a legacy gift as well as to off-set the costs of their grad activities (i.e., Dinner Dance).

In order to participate in these events, Grade 12 students will need to be in "good standing" and on a path to graduate this June by meeting the following criteria:

- Regular attendance and in good standing with regards to behaviour and expectations
- Currently passing all required courses for graduation (English 12, CLC & Capstone 12)
- Will have more than 80 credits accumulated by June 30th

For those students who do not meet the criteria above, they will NOT have the opportunity to participate in these grad events until they are in a position to graduate or have a confirmed plan endorsed by myself and their counsellor beyond the end of this school year. When a student has a confirmed plan and is considered in good standing, I will review their progress and eligibility for future school sponsored graduation events.

One of the requirements for graduation is the successful completion of the Career Life Connection 12 (CLC) and a Capstone Project. On our <u>school website</u> (*Delta Secondary > Student Resources > Grad Items > CLC & Capstone*) you will find information regarding the course, a course outline and timeline for completing assignments and the capstone. CLC 12 & Capstone is taught online through Google Classroom and Mrs. Hansen will be running Flex Blocks to support students over the school year. Mrs. Hansen's email is phansen@deltalearns.ca.

Dear Delta Secondary graduating students and families,

The intent of this document is to create transparency regarding our expectations for the students in the grade 12 class. These expectations are not set up to be punitive towards our students, but to encourage our students to respect and follow Delta Secondary's Code of Conduct and to demonstrate positive work habits by remaining focused until the end of the school year.

Our expectations include:

- Regular attendance to all classes
- No involvement with drugs or alcohol at school that includes before or during schoolsponsored events, activities, or field trips. We wish to protect students from any of the personal, school-based, or legal ramifications of making reckless decisions under the influence of alcohol or drugs. We also wish to respect staff and volunteers who organize, sponsor and/or supervise school/grad events.
- No involvement in any activity deemed a "prank", whether in the school or not, that
 jeopardizes the safety, well-being, security of others and/or property. A "prank" is any
 activity carried out by students that:
 - Causes damage to school property or to property in the community
 - o Incurs a financial cost to individuals, the district or businesses in the community
 - Causes damage to our school's reputation
 - Negatively impacts the physical or emotional well-being of Delta District students, staff and/or the community.
 - Disrupts teaching and learning
- Meet and exceed all of the expectations outlined in Delta Secondary's Code of Conduct that can be reviewed on Delta Secondary's website. The Code of Conduct can be accessed using the link: https://de.deltasd.bc.ca/our-school/schedule/

Consequences may include:

- 1. Denied participation in future grad events, including the Grad Boat Cruise, Dinner and Dance, Commencement, or any other Grad related activities
- 2. In or out of school suspension
- 3. Administrative transfer to another Delta school or program.
