Dear Pacer Families,

With October coming to an end, the cool crisp mornings and the colourful leaves falling remind us that fall is officially upon us. A reminder to students and families that the days are getting shorter and we encourage those who walk or bike to wear bright colours, reflective clothing and to be conscious of vehicles and drivers when visibility is limited. We also would like to remind parents NOT to drop students off at the front door when we have inclement weather (i.e., rain). Please use the designated areas to drop off your child(ren) and please be sure not to block drive ways, cross walks or access points for other vehicles and pedestrians.

Last night we held our Parent Teacher Interviews and it was a lovely opportunity to connect with some of our Pacer families. If you were not able to book an appointment with your child(ren)'s teacher, please send them an email to set up a time to chat about your child's progress in their courses. With Halloween on Tuesday, I know many of our students are excited for Halloween and we look forward to seeing all the creative and detailed costumes.

Halloween Safety:

Halloween is fast approaching and as students gear up for a night of tricks and treats, it's important to remember to stay safe and respectful while celebrating the spookiest night of the season:

- **No Face Masks** If wearing a costume to school, students should be easily recognizable and/or able to identify themselves to any staff members when asked
- Respectful Costumes costumes that are offensive in any way will not be allowed.
 - Please consider the rights maintained in the Canadian Human Rights Act when selecting costumes (e.g., race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, family status, genetic characteristics, disability)
- School codes of conduct must always be followed, even when in costume.
 - This includes maintaining respectful and appropriate behaviour with others and with school property. Replica weapons (guns, knives, etc.) are not allowed.
- Students should be aware that fireworks and firecrackers are prohibited on school property and the city of Delta.

In recent years, there has been an increase in anti-social behaviour from some youth in the community at Halloween. We recognize that this type of behaviour varies widely from school to school, from community to community, and even from year to year. *However, we would like to remind students that vandalizing property, setting fires, fighting and underage drinking can have serious and potentially lifelong consequences including suspension from school, criminal charges, a criminal record, and injury.*





We would appreciate all parents/caregivers having a conversation with their child(ren) regarding the need to respect our community and to keep Halloween safe and fun for everyone.

Musqueam Day:

Musqueam Day Monday, November 1st is an important day for the Musqueam First Nation. November 1 represents the day in which Musqueam changed the history of Indigenous rights and title for all Indigenous Nations in Canada - the Crown must now recognize Indigenous title to Indigenous land. On November 1st, 1984 Musqueam won a landmark case with the Supreme Court of Canada called the Guerin Case. This day has since been celebrated as Musqueam Day. Provincial Assessments – Literacy 10/12 & Numeracy 10:

Literacy 10, Numeracy 10 & Literacy 12 are required components of the graduation program and students in grade 10 - 12 must write all three Provincial Assessments prior to graduation. These assessments focus on the demonstration and application of numeracy and literacy. Students will be excused from their scheduled classes for any assessments that they need to write. Below are the dates the assessments taking place this school year:

- Literacy 12 October 30th
- Literacy 10 January 15th 26th
- Numeracy 10 April 15th 19th
- Provincial Assessments June 10th 14th
 - Specific assessment dates and times will be shared in an email to students and families closer to the date.





Attendance & Student Absences:

Student attendance is directly correlated to student success in the classroom. Students are expected to be in class, on time, unless there is a justifiable reason for absence. *When students are absent, they miss valuable teacher instruction, opportunities to demonstrate their learning, and the shared experiences that help build class belonging and connectedness*. **A "parent excused absence" is still considered an absence** - these absences are known and acknowledged by the parents. Occasionally, students must miss classes for unavoidable reasons such as illness or emergencies. A reminder to parents to contact the school by phone (604-946-4194) or email (delta.sec@deltaschools.ca) to advise us of the absence and it will be recorded on our attendance system.
