### 2022 - 2023 Secondary Futures - Schedule:

Secondary schools are working with the Delta School District to look at scheduling options (semester or linear), and innovations (Flex Time, Collaboration Days, etc.) to best support student learning, engagement and teachers in the successful delivery of curriculum and instruction for the 2022 – 2023 school year while meeting the requirements prescribed by the Ministry of Education.

Over the next month, our school staff will be participating in discussions and examining evidence to support our decision making. We are currently working with the district to develop an information gathering process that will allow us to gather information from students, parents and school staff. More communication regarding this will be coming out shortly and your thoughts and feedback are appreciated information in the coming months.

### **DSS PAC President Message:**

The DSS "PAC" (Parent Advisory Council) is the official collective voice of the parent community and is made up of all DSS students' parents/guardians. It is the forum for parents to provide feedback to the school respecting any matter relating to the education of their students. The DSS PAC has an executive consisting of six positions: Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, Communications and DPAC Rep. They hold seven monthly meetings each school year (3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month), which are currently held virtually and include a school update report presented by Principal John Pavão.

A major role of the PAC is to manage the spending of the BC Gaming grant of approximately \$23,000 (\$20 per student), by budgeting the funds according to teacher wish-lists aimed at enhancing student extracurricular opportunities. There is no other PAC fundraising done at DSS. The PAC will need new executive members next year, to fill the openings left by four retiring members. Please consider volunteering one or two hours a month for your child's school!
