Dear Pacer Families,

I hope you all have had the opportunity to review your child's Quarter 1 final Report Card. A copy of the report card can be seen in your child's MyED student portal as well as through our Connect System (Parent Connect/Student Connect). The report card provides information on the final assessment for Quarter 1 classes and allows for students and their parents to gain a better understanding of their child's progress in each of these courses. As we near the second week of Quarter 2, the report card should serve as a time of reflection, goal setting and action planning for this quarter—with the goal to maintain or improve student performance around learning.

While it takes a village to raise a child, it is the responsibility of the individual student to take responsibility for their learning and to create a plan for continued or future success. Students need to be committed to their learning, have supports at home as well as school in order to create positive routines. In meeting families regarding report card results, the same themes seem to come out over and over again with regards to student success:

- Committing to an organizer (paper-based agenda, electronic calendar or app)
- Regular attendance in classes
- Completing homework, learning activities and assignments
- Seeking out assistance or additional help during Flexible Learning Time
- Establishing a focused study routine and environment at home

*Ultimately it comes down to creating positive work habits at school and at home.* Teachers will be reaching out in the next week if your child is struggling in their courses and we ask that you continue to communicate with teachers around your child's progress. While this year is not a normal or typical year, we will continue to try and create as much normalcy as possible in our students' educational experience while supporting them on their educational journey.

### **COVID-19 Safety Reminders:**

- **Washing hands or using sanitizer before entering** the building or a classroom;
- **Not sharing food or snacks** with peers and friends;
- Remembering to **“Be kind, be calm, be safe” to others.**

### Informing the School of COVID Related Health Issues:

In the event that a family experiences testing protocols related to the COVID-19 virus, we are requesting that families contact an administrator to inform us of the testing results as soon as possible. We would like to centralize the collection of this information, so we can effectively follow up to keep our community safe.
