

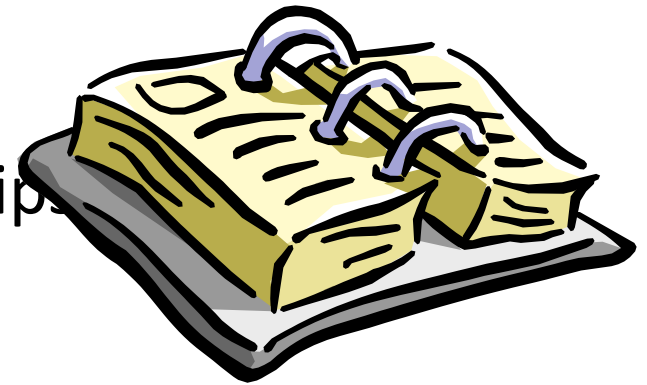

- *Your future plans dictate the courses you need in addition to secondary requirements*



Career Life Connections 12 & Capstone Project

- CLC 12 - focuses on **three major themes** to prepare you for life after high school:
 - **Personal Development** (preparation for post graduation)
 - **Connections to Community** (perspectives and transferable skills)
 - **Career Life Plan** (career, finances, education, health & well being)
- **Capstone** – *culminating project in an area of personal interest or related to future aspirations* that is presented in the Spring (April 2024) under one of the **four capstone areas**:
 - **Inquiry/Research Based Capstone**
 - **Event Planning/Service Based Capstone**
 - **Project Based Capstone**
 - **Career/Entrepreneurial Based Capstone**

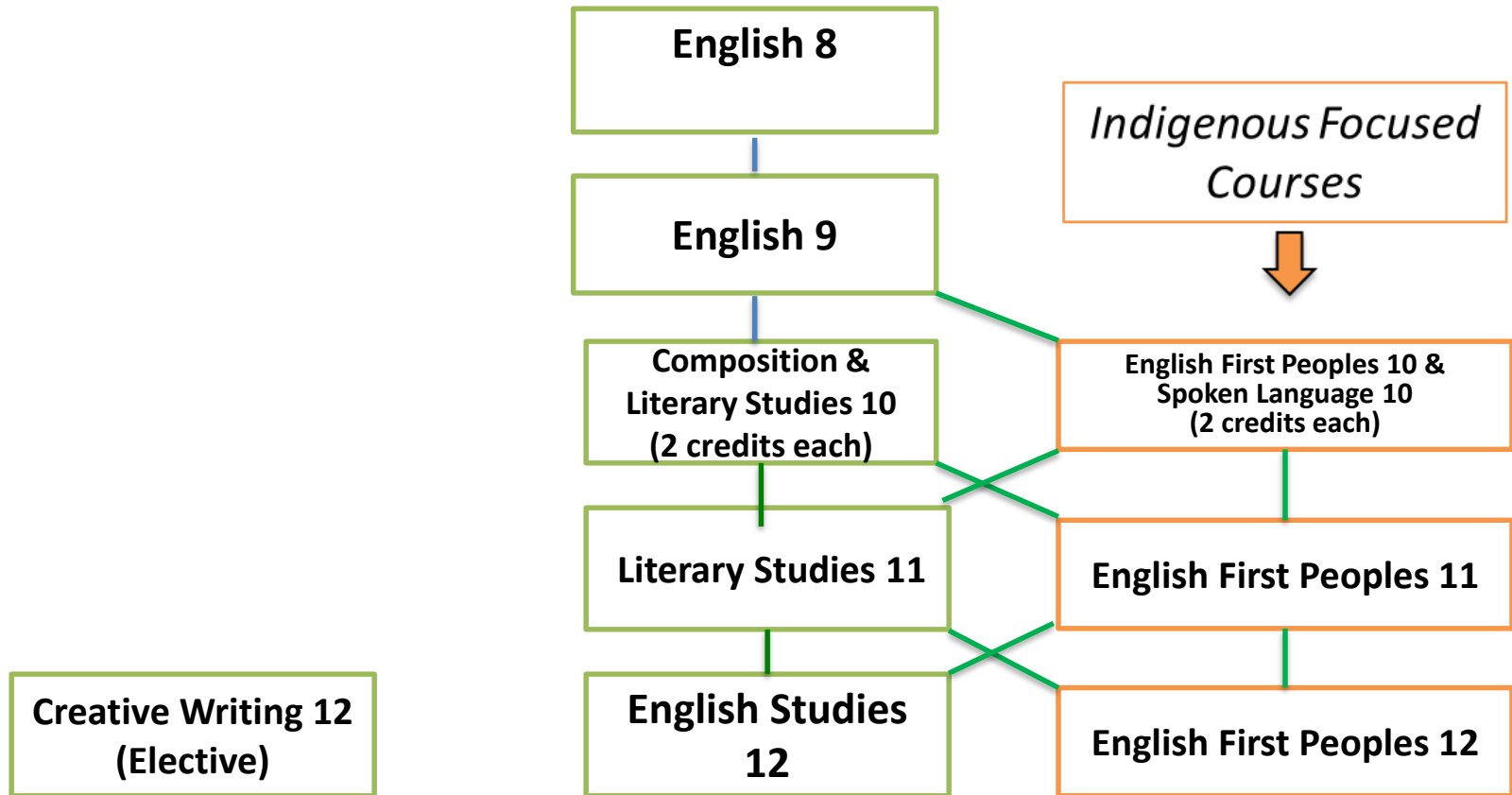

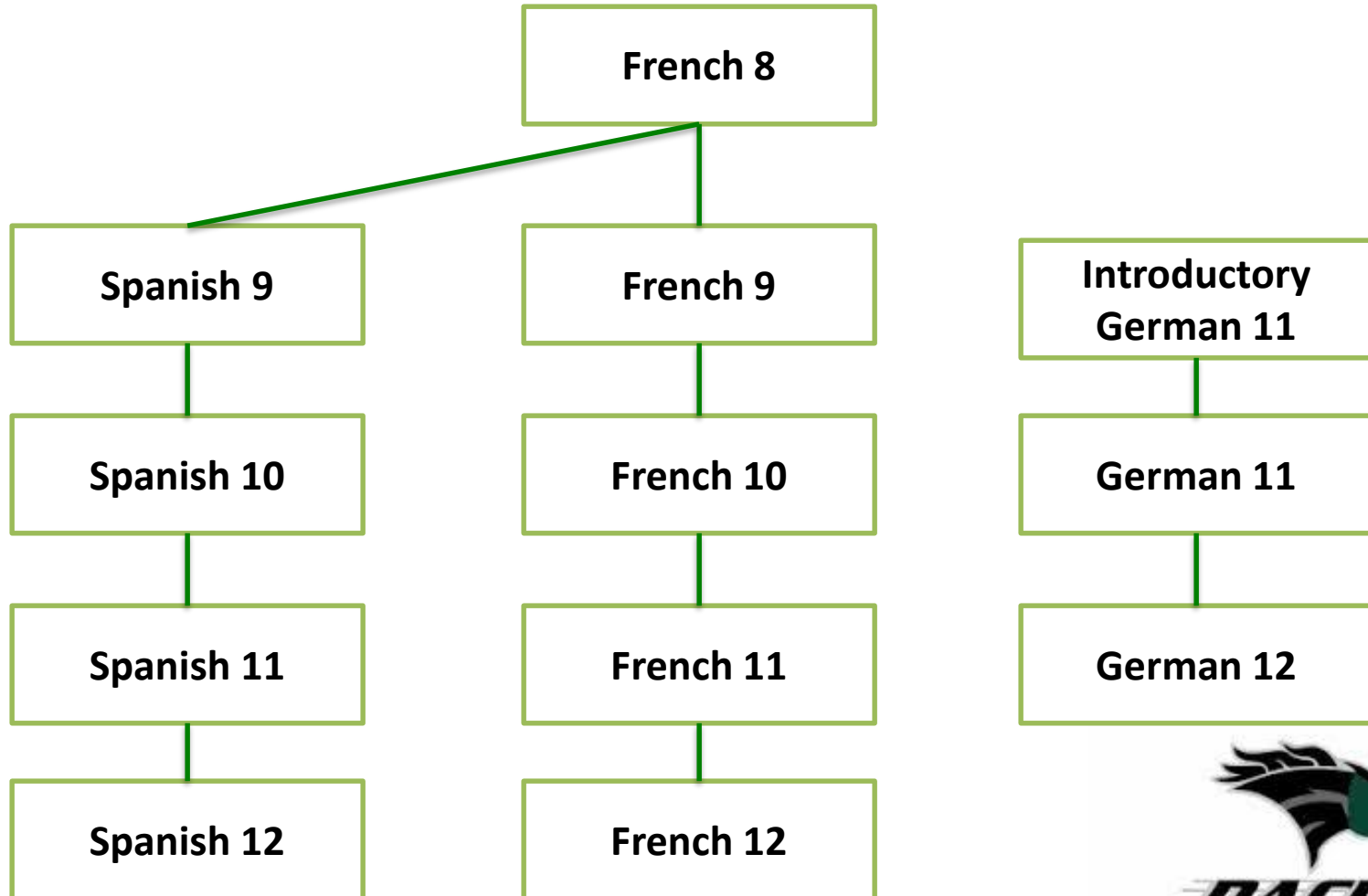

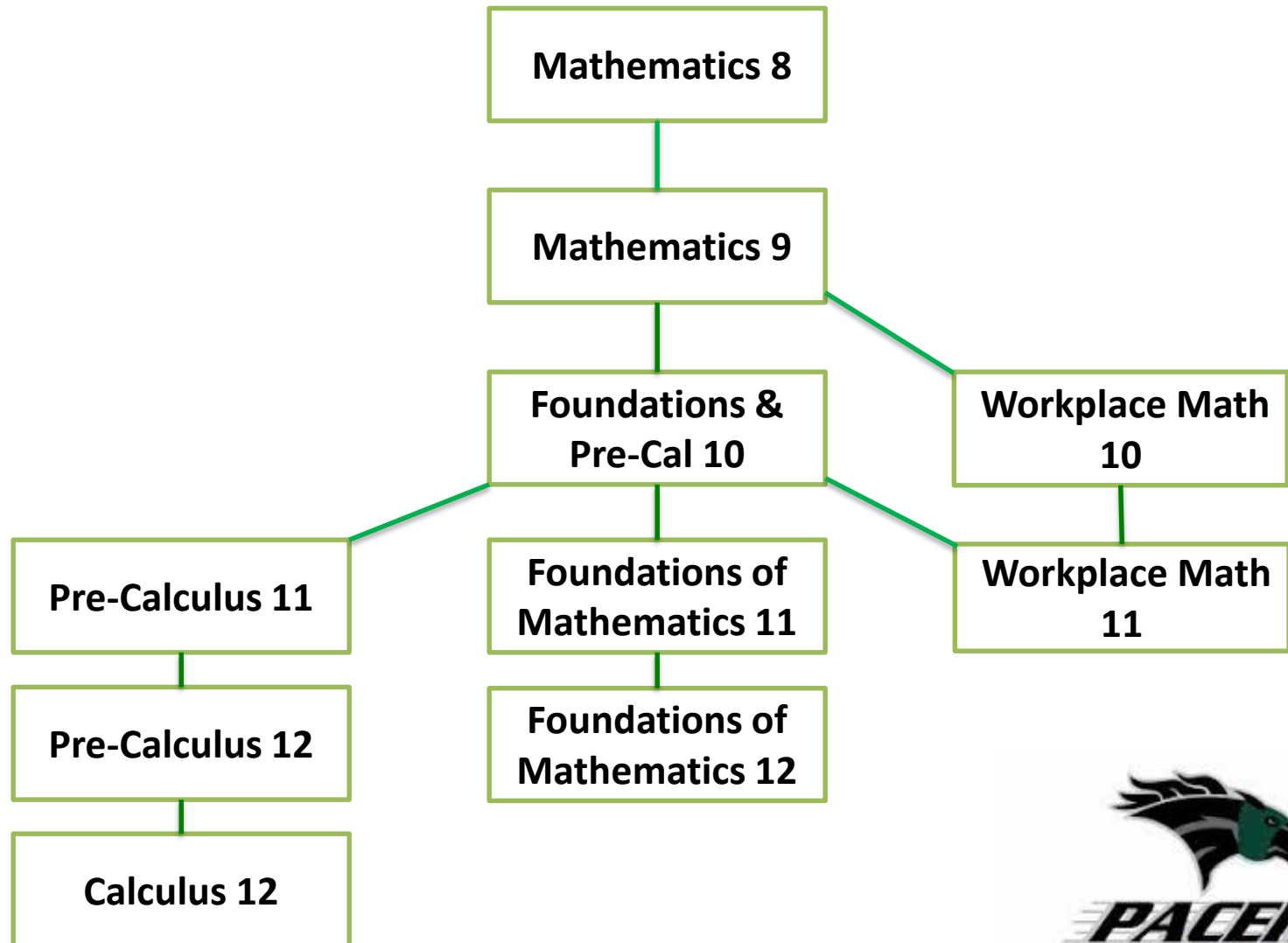
English Courses Flow Chart



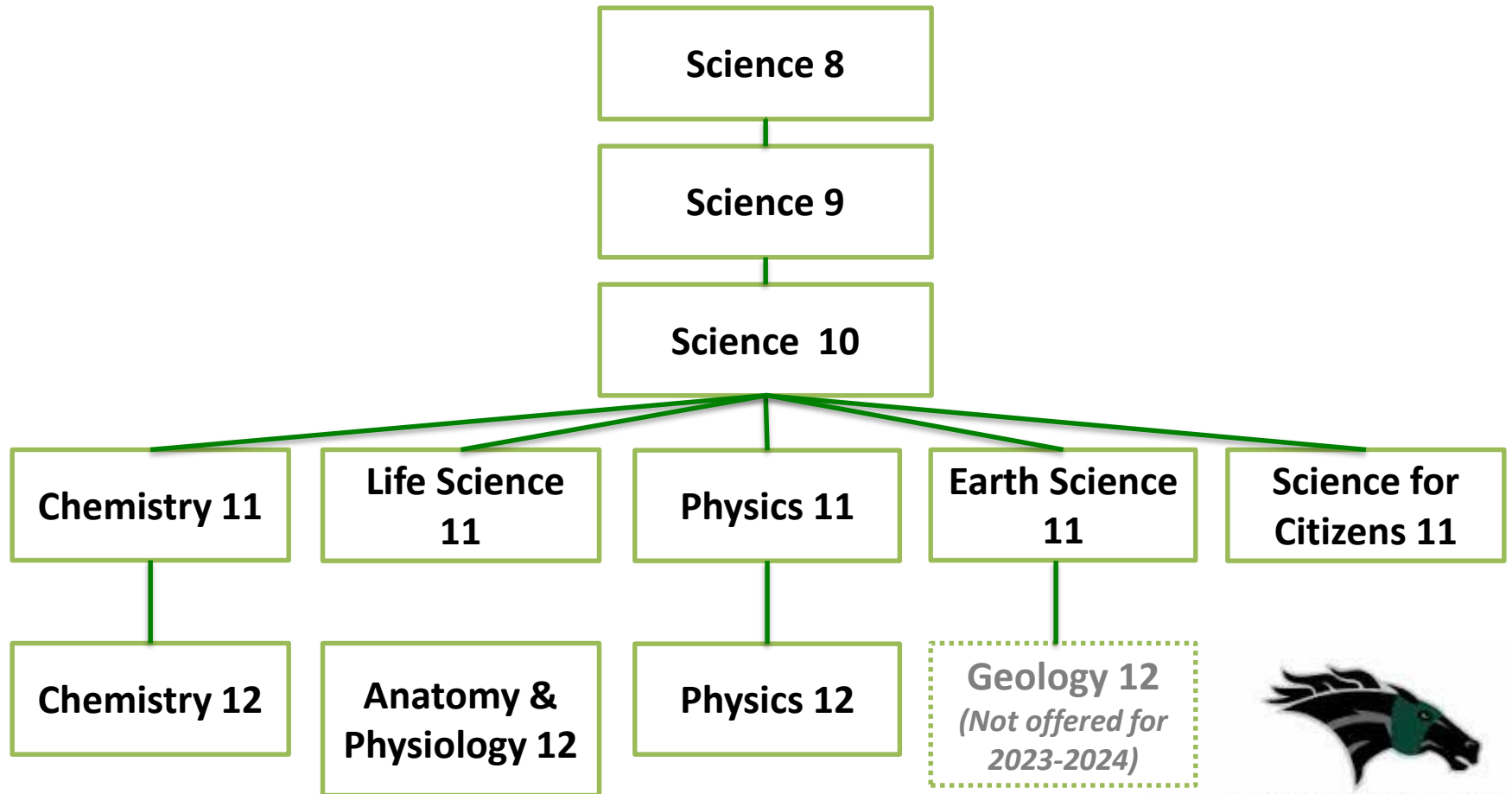
Language Courses Flow Chart



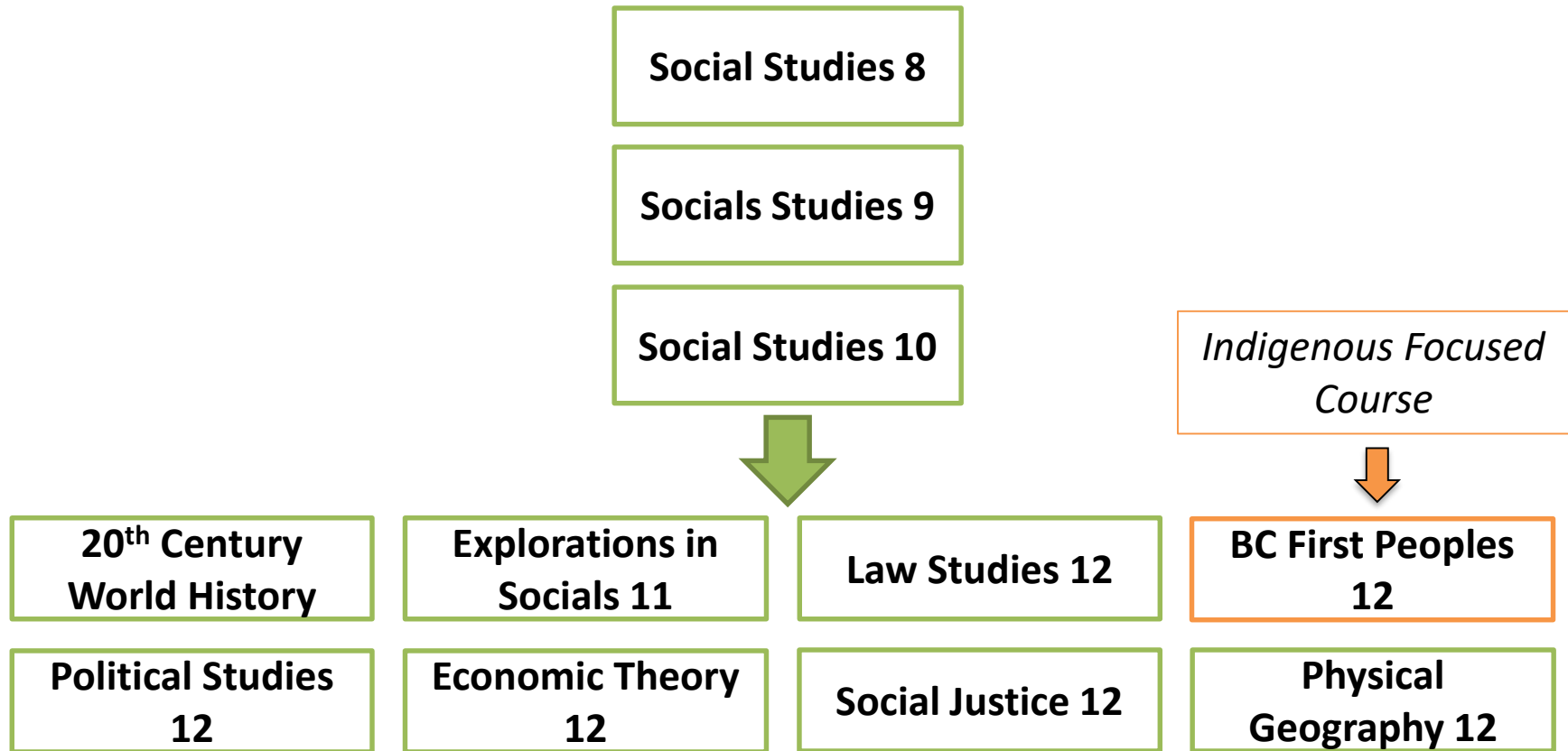
Mathematics Courses Flow Chart

Social Studies Courses Flow Chart



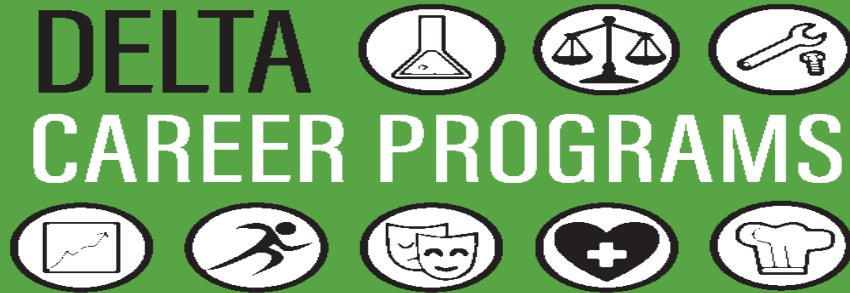

Important Registration Information

- Course Selection Due Date : **March 3, 2023**
- Gr.10: 8 courses – 6 required / 2 electives + 2 Alt
- Gr.11: 8 courses – 4 required / 4 electives + 2 Alt
- Gr.12: 8 courses – 2 required / 6-7 electives + 3 Alt
 - “Required” are mandatory courses (Grad Requirements)
 - *Students need to prioritize their electives and alternates by 1st, 2nd, and 3rd preference to assist with generating complete student schedules*



Process for Choosing Courses

1. Student logs on to their MyEDBC account

2. Top Tab: “My Info” - Side Tab: “Requests”
3. Make Selections
4. Select “Post” to finalize requests
