

 - Career/Entrepreneurial Based Capstone




English Courses Flow Chart




Creative Writing 12 (Elective)




Language Courses Flow Chart




Mathematics Courses Flow Chart

- Gr.10: 8 courses 6 required / 2 electives + 2 Alt
- Gr.11: 8 courses 4 required / 4 electives + 2 Alt
- Gr.12: 8 courses 2 required / 6-7 electives + 3 Alt
 - "Required" are mandatory courses (Grad Requirements)
 - Students need to prioritize their electives and alternates by 1st, 2nd, and 3rd preference to assist with generating complete student schedules
