- Gr.10: 8 courses -6 required $/ 2$ electives +2 Alt
- Gr.11: 8 courses -4 required $/ 4$ electives +2 Alt
- Gr.12: 8 courses -2 required / 6-7 electives +3 Alt
- "Required" are mandatory courses (Grad Requirements)
- Students need to prioritize their electives and alternates by $1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }}$, and $3^{r d}$ preference to assist with generating complete student schedules
