Semester 2 Schedules

In order to assist with a smooth transition to semester 2, we are asking students in **Gr. 10-12** to view their schedules on MyED ahead of January 29th. Any student who would like to request a course change are asked to email or see their counsellor.

Unfortunately, we are limited in the number of changes that we can make to a student's schedule due to class size, class composition, and timetable limitations.



Students must attend all scheduled classes until they receive a response from their counsellor. Please note that students current schedules may change before semester 2 as counsellors continue to work to balance classes.

Provincial Assessments-Literacy 10

All students prior to graduation, as part of the graduation program, are required to complete three assessments (Numeracy 10, Literacy 10 & Literacy 12) in addition to the 80 credits (minimum requirement). Career Life/Capstone Presentation

On December 6 & 7 Delta Secondary School's Paige Hansen hosted a decision scientist and local teacher who led Grade 12s in two sessions about decision making and the importance of making good choices as they move into this next very exciting time in their lives. Brooke Moore (District Principal of Curriculum and Innovation) and Robin Gregory (University of British Columbia) introduced a

decision-making framework called the Decision Maker Moves (DMM) and illustrated how each of the six steps can be used to improve the choices they make. Brooke and Robin's hope is that these young adults would begin to apply the DMMs to a wide variety of choices, ranging from minor decisions made every day to the larger choices that can create stress, confusion, and frustration.



Rosie's Network Club Empowering Students in STEM

This year, the Rosie's Network club, of now 35 members, expanded its outreach to Hawthorne Elementary and Neilson Grove Elementary, inspiring 280 students overall, and actively reaching more schools. The club has been able to secure funding to introduce new experiments like "The Magic of Water Density" and "The Power of Electricity" and broaden our lesson plans.



Looking ahead, the club's goal is to expand Rosie's Network into a district-wide organization that empowers girls in STEM across the wider region. The club hopes to establish a Rosie's Network club at each secondary school within the district, with each club led by its own president. Our current club president, Inbal Tzafrir, plans to support these presidents by providing thorough lesson plans that include all necessary material lists, costs, and detailed step-bystep video demonstrations. This initiative can encourage young students, strengthen community connections, and inspire more girls to see themselves as future engineers, scientists, and innovators.

All Grade 12 students have been enrolled in CLC 12 and must complete a graduating Capstone project as part of their graduation requirements. School Fees

Every year a general school fee is assessed as well as enhancement fees in a number of courses. This year there will also be a \$10 Emergency Fee assessed by the District. Notification of the fees owed by your child according to the courses in which they are enrolled are now viewable on Parent Connect and fee statements will be emailed to families with outstanding fees. Fees are payable online using Parent Connect or by cheque, cash, or card at the DSS office. If paying by cash or cheque at the office, please include your child's name and grade. Delta Secondary is committed to ensuring that no student is denied the opportunity to participate in a course, class or program because of financial hardship. Any family requiring assistance with school fees are asked to contact Mr. Vasconcelos.

Student Attendance

Developing effective attendance habits, as well as being to class on time, requires the cooperation of students, parents, the school, and the community. We must work together to promote, carefully monitor, and encourage regular attendance and good work habits. A review of our data



from previous years clearly indicates that poor attendance is linked to poor achievement.

To report a student absence please:

Absences should be reported as early as possible on the day of the absence to allow a Parent Advised code to be entered into the system. Any unreported absences will result in an automated email from the student system, which will email a message by default.



International Program-Looking For Homestay Families

Hello Delta School District families.

Delta School District International Programs is currently recruiting homestay families for international students coming to Delta School District for February 2025, summer 2025, and September 2025. They will arrive from all over the world and have a strong desire to be in Delta.

The reimbursement for hosting is \$1,150 per month. Multiple students from different nationalities can be hosted in one home. The majority of students in the homestay program are from Germany, Japan, Spain, Italy, and Brazil. At the moment, more than 20 different countries are represented in the homestay program.

Many are looking for a family connection and being a part of a family during their stay in Delta. Their study periods range from 3 months to half a school year, to a full school year, to multiple years. There are also short-term summer programs where host parents welcome younger English learners into their home. It is a great way for students to see what school (and life) in Delta is like and for new homestay families to get a small sample of what hosting is like.
