## COUNSELLING SERVICES

- Students can meet with counsellors to discuss mental health concerns, social or emotional situations or concerns with courses
- Students generally make an email appointment unless they're in a crisis
- Limits of confidentiality: what students disclose to counsellors is generally confidential, unless:
  - The student gives permission to discuss with others
  - The student discusses thoughts about harming themselves or others
  - Harm is being done to the student



# REQUIRED COURSES AND GRAD REQUIREMENTS

#### GRADUATION CREDITS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Each course taken and PASSED will be assigned 2 numerical values:
  - % Final Grade
  - 4 Credits earned
- Credits are accumulated in order to meet the required (80) for graduation
- Requirements are those courses that ALL BC STUDENTS must take in order to graduate

- Indigenous Focused Course at Gr. 10, 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- Electives (28 credits in total 16 credits at Gr 12 level

80 CREDITS MINIMUM FOR GRADUATION
1 course is 4 credits

# INDIGENOUS FOCUS GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- One of the following courses will count towards meeting this graduation requirement:
  - English First Peoples 12 (also English credit)
  - BC First Peoples 12 (also Socials credit)
  - English First Peoples New Media & Literary Studies I 0
  - English First Peoples Writing & Literary Studies 10
  - English First Peoples Writing & Spoken Language 10

# REQUIRED ASSESSMENTS GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- Numeracy Assessment 10
- Literacy Assessment 10 & 12
  - Not associated with a particular course (i.e. Math Precalculus 10 or English 12)
  - 4-point proficiency scale to assess Literacy Skills
  - up to 3 attempts permitted (both Gr. 10 & 12)
- Results will appear on transcripts and best outcome will be recorded




# **CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS 12**& CAPSTONE PROJECT


- CLC 12 focuses on three major themes to prepare you for life after high school:

  - Career/Entrepreneurial Based Capstone




#### **ENGLISH COURSES FLOW CHART**



## COURSE SELECTION LANGUAGE CONSIDERATIONS

- Languages courses are electives NOT graduation requirements
- Languages are no longer an admission requirement for any post secondary B.C. schools
- Languages II / I2 MAY be a program requirement for some post secondary programs (Faculty of Arts)
  - Please make appointment with career advisor to confirm program requirements



# EXTERNAL CREDITS

COUNTING OUT OF SCHOOL PROGRAMS TOWARDS GRADUATION CREDITS

#### PROGRAMS THAT EARN GRADUATION CREDITS:

- Dance (Royal Academy of Dance)
- Music (Royal Conservatory of Music)
- Sports (Provincial or National team level)
- Lifesaving (Bronze Cross, NLS, Instructor)
- Cadets (National Defense Cadet Certification)
- Coaching (Level 1-2, First Aid, 75-150 hours)
- Official (Theory, evaluation, 75-125 hours)
- Driver Ed. (ICBC accredited program)
- FirstAid (WCB level II and III)



## COURSE SELECTION LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAMS

- Language Challenge Exam Options are available to students with a language background, to earn language 11/12 credits
  - Mandarin / Japanese / Korean / Punjabi
  - German / Spanish
- Registration takes place in early Fall 2025
- These challenge courses may not be used for post secondary admissions at some schools.



# ONLINE COURSES

VARIETY OF PATHWAYS AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS

### ONLINE COURSE CONSIDERATIONS

- Academic and non-Academic courses available
  - Fully accredited courses towards graduation
  - Courses appear on transcripts just like classroom courses do
- Rigor of academic topics is similar to direct instruction classes
  - Students required to be self-motivated
  - Depth and breadth is not as significant as direct instruction classes!
- Students in Gr. II & I2 may be considered for a DL block if
  - Taking a course not offered at DSS
  - DSS unable to provide a course required for graduation due to timetable constraints



#### ONLINE COURSE CONSIDERATIONS

- Students are expected to communicate with counselors that they are planning to take online courses
  - Course Selection vs Online courses
  - Course Selection vs Summer School
- Students will not be automatically dropped from classroom course should they want to take an online course.
  - Proof of registration may be requested
  - Proof of graduation requirements being met
  - Proof of parental support / responsibility taken.



# COURSE SELECTION STUDY BLOCKS


- Gr 10-12 students are expected to take a full course load (8 courses) at DSS
- Gr. 12 students who are on track for graduation with sufficient credits and requirements will have a block open in their timetable to complete CLC/Capstone courses (outside the timetable).
- Students in Gr. 11 & 12 may apply to have a study block but a strict requirement must be met
  - Study Block requirements available in the course planning booklet

- This can be for any red seal trade. The supervisor must be a certified journeyperson

- If accepted, the school district will pay the tuition
- Applications due before spring break
- For students going into grades 11 or 12 the following school year
